

Rainbow Acres Update

Here is an update from Rainbow Acres Ranch where 86 Ranchers live, thrive and continue to grow.



Thank you for your partnership with the work and ministry entrusted to us with the beloved Ranchers. For the past seven months we have been Covid-19 free since the outbreak began.

The Greenhouse Crew has set new records this year for the

quality – and the quantity – of the vege-

tables they've produced this summer! For the last harvest Rodolfo and the Ranchers gathered 300 more pounds of produce that was delivered to the kitchen. With this harvest, Rainbow Acres has reached the end of an amazing summer production season, totaling over 2,500 pounds of produce! Produce was also shared with senior centers in the Verde Valley.

Over the past nine months, Rainbow Acres' Buildings & Grounds staff, ac-

companied by volunteers, has renovated interior spaces at the Daehler Building and the Worden

Taber Center. Led by Marvin Phelps (Construction Superintendent), the renovations took place in phases and resulted in totally transformed spaces for a new, expanded Weaving Room (now located where the group recreation area used to be in the Daehler Building) and a newlyenvisioned Music Room (in the Worden Taber Center).



Ranchers played a fun game of "Solar System Bingo" in Rainbow Academy's Astronomy class. The Ranchers en-

rolled in this class have been studying the planets, constellations and features of our solar system. Each time a planet was called, they reviewed the features of that planet (its size, make-up, unique features like rings, and its order from the sun). This game helps boost cognitive abilities by encouraging brain processing,



alertness, memory capability and hand-eye coordination. The Ranchers think that astronomy is "out of this world"!

For your partnership and care for Rainbow Acres, we thank you for helping us create a little "heaven on earth" for the Ranchers, for staff and servant teams who come to serve. You are a gift to each one who lives and serves at Rainbow Acres Ranch.

Melatonin

More than 3 million Americans take melatonin to help them sleep. Most people assume it is safe. But this supplement can reduce the effectiveness of certain medications and it has potentially dangerous side effects. Another thing is that people who take melatonin do so

at the wrong time or for problems it will not solve. Contrary to popular belief melatonin will NOT help you fall asleep. Melatonin is safe for most people but it has been shown to decrease the effectiveness of certain crucial medications including blood pressure drugs, seizure prevention drugs, antidepressants and birth control medications. It can increase blood sugar levels making it dangerous for diabetics. Other potential side effects include headaches, dizziness, stomach irritation, irritability and grogginess. An appropriate initial dose is about 0.5 mg 90 minutes before bedtime. If this proves ineffective gradually increase the dosage but do not exceed 5 mg. If you are diabetic talk with your doctor.

RECOMMENDATION & VOTE FOR A PASTORAL SEARCH TEAM

Upon the retirement of Pastor Jeff, the Rev. Sam Brink was called to be our interim pastor. During this time of transition, a Pastoral Search Team is in the process of being formed.

On October 20th, the Church Council approved and is recommending five people to serve on the Pastoral Search Team. The congregation will be asked to approve at the Annual Meeting on November 22nd via Zoom. The 5 people that the Church Council are recommending to the congregation are **Amanda Gley, Jeff Kronser, Kelly Roberts, Don Vaught, and Mark Werder**. According to the Constitution, the Moderator, Debbie Herr and the Church Clerk, Carol Snider, are ex-officio members on the Pastoral Search Team with full voting rights.

The purpose of the Pastoral Search Team is to discern the best candidate for the pastoral position and will recommend that person to the congregation. The five members recommended by the Church Council to serve on the Pastoral Search Team demonstrate the following characteristics:

- Has a good level of spiritual maturity and is prayerful.
- Is able to keep confidences within the Search Team only ~ not sharing any information with spouse, family, friends or any other members in the congregation and the community.
- Is forward thinking and able to articulate the vision for FBCS.
- Has a good level of trust in God's working in and through the process.
- Is teachable, willing to learn the search process, and willing to do the work.
- Demonstrates integrity and has the trust and respect of the congregation.
- Is open to the candidacy of all persons whom God might be calling to FBCS.

Once the Pastoral Search Team is approved by the congregation they will meet with Rev. Steve Bils, the Executive Minister of the American Baptist Churches of the Central Pacific Coast and he will explain the pastoral search process. The Pastoral Search Team will follow the steps cited in the "Calling An American Baptist Minister" manual.

The search process is a spiritual exercise in discerning God's will for FBCS. Discernment takes patience and an open mind and spirit to the possibilities God has for FBCS. This is just the next step of the journey that has its own timeline.

Please pray for each member on the Pastoral Search Team and for the person God has for our next spiritual leader. The Pastoral Search Team will need to be very confidential regarding the information provided in resumes and interviews of pastors that will be reviewed during the process. However, the Pastoral Search Team will give the congregation periodic updates during the pastoral search process.

We are praying and seeking God on how He wants us to be involved with this beautiful ministry.

We have also been blessed to get to know Ajarn (Pastor) Tim Dee (director of Thailand Karen Baptist Convention) and his family these past couple of months. They have invited us to join them for family outings and have shown us a couple parts of the city. Last weekend, we went with the Dee family to the Karen tribal village of Baan Jam Luang and stayed in their family home. It was a great time to relax, soak in the amazing view of the mountains, and enjoy a break from the city. We were humbled and blessed by the hospitality of the Karen people as they showered us with gifts of rice, vegetables and pineapples to bring home. We enjoyed getting to know the Dee family more deeply, and our kids had a good time playing together. Mark was also given the opportunity for his first preaching experience in Thailand. He did a wonderful job sharing God's word and working with the translator.

You can see our schedule has been quite full with new experiences and opportunities for growing a community for our family. We are thankful to have partners here in Thailand who are becoming friends. We are thankful for opportunities to see more of God's beautiful creation in the artistic landscapes that surround us, and we are thankful that God daily reminds us of His presence as we walk this journey. We know He is opening doors for relationships and community building both with believers and non-believers, and we are doing our best to be patient.
